Applicant must actively participate in struggles for civil rights, economic justice, international solidarity or other progressive issues.

Membership in the Public Relations Student Society of America (PRSSA) is preferred, but is not a requirement. A major or minor in public relations is also preferred. You must be of African-American/Black, Hispanic/Latino, Asian, Native American, Alaskan Native or Pacific Islander ancestry. You must have attained at least junior status and have at most one full term remaining. You also must have earned and maintained a minimum 3.0 grade point average.

Applicants must be of Hispanic origin and/or must significantly participate in and promote organizations and activities in the Hispanic community.

The Essay of approximately 500 words should concentrate on an area of the world or an international issue that is in keeping with the applicant's interest. It can be in the form of a story, news analysis or a traditional essay.
